

We will be following CDC guidelines for this Assembly. Therefore, the use of masks will be optional and there will be no social distancing requirement or limit to the number of gathered persons except those limits determined by local fire and safety codes. This is the standard currently being followed by the city of Charleston and the Marriott. We have hand sanitizer and masks available in various locations throughout our meeting space.

We certainly expect any attendees who tested positive or exhibited symptoms of COVID-19 prior to Assembly have stayed home. Per the CDC, people with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. Anyone can have mild to severe symptoms. Typical symptoms include:

- Fever or chills**
- Cough**
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing**
- Fatigue**
- Muscle or body aches**
- Headache**
- New loss of taste or smell**
- Sore throat**
- Congestion or runny nose**

Should an attendee develop any of these symptoms once at Assembly, we expect them to isolate until such time as they can return home. If an attendee develops symptoms, we ask that they report this to their rostered leader who would then report this to Pastor Emily Edenfield, Assistant to the Bishop, immediately. If an attendee does not have a rostered leader to report to, they should immediately report this to Pastor Emily Edenfield, Assistant to the Bishop.
