Dr. Amy-Jill Levine is the Rabbi Stanley M. Kessler Distinguished Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies, Hartford International University for Religion and Peace.

She is University Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies Emerita, Mary Jane Werthan Professor of Jewish Studies Emerita, and Professor of New Testament Studies Emerita, Vanderbilt University.

Professor Levine has given close to 1000 lectures on the Bible, Christian-Jewish relations, and Religion, Gender, and Sexuality across the globe. In addition to receiving three audiences with Pope Francis, in 2019 she was the first Jew to teach New Testament at Rome's Pontifical Biblical Institute.



Her many books include *The Misunderstood Jew: The Church and the Scandal of the Jewish Jesus*; *Short Stories by Jesus: The Enigmatic Parables of a Controversial Rabbi*; *The Meaning of the Bible: What the Jewish Scriptures and the Christian Old Testament Can Teach Us* (with Douglas Knight); *The Pharisees* (co-edited with Joseph Sievers), to which Pope Francis contributed an essay; and six "beginner's guides" to the Gospels. She co-edited *The Jewish Annotated New Testament*, is the editor of the 13-volume *Feminist Companions to the New Testament and Early Christian Writings*, and has also co-authored several children's books on biblical stories with Rabbi Sandy Eisenberg Sasso.

She is University Professor of New Testament and Jewish Studies Emerita, Mary Jane Werthan Professor of Jewish Studies Emerita, and Professor of New Testament Studies Emerita, Vanderbilt University.

Professor Levine has given close to 1000 lectures on the Bible, Christian-Jewish relations, and Religion, Gender, and Sexuality across the globe. In addition to receiving three audiences with Pope Francis, in 2019 she was the first Jew to teach New Testament at Rome's Pontifical Biblical Institute.
