Nearly 300 years ago Lutherans from Europe began settling in various places in North America in large numbers. Beginning with the organization of the Ministerium of Pennsylvania in 1748, they organized as Synods in order to work together to serve the needs of the original colonies.

By the time the South Carolina Synod organized in 1824, the Lutheran community had been firmly established in what was now the United States. And, by the time the Synod was established, many congregations had formed in various parts of South Carolina, that the Synod could separate from the North Carolina Synod.

Thus, our story as a Synod began. Today, after two centuries, we remember that story as a story of perseverance in the faith and an ongoing commitment to the Gospel witness in South Carolina. And, of course, many people in South Carolina today claim genealogical roots in the original churches here.

Remembering the legacy of the past also leads us to our own stories of ministry in the present and the future. Truly, God is at work in the South Carolina Synod! We pray that our celebration of our shared history will serve as a guide and an inspiration to a bright future.

Further, we pray for God's blessings in our continued journey of faith as we meet the challenges that lay before us.
