The 2026 SC Synod Assembly will be held June 11-13, 2026 at the Brookland Baptist Banquet and Conference Center, West Columbia, SC.

The theme of our 2026 South Carolina Synod Assembly is "Created to Create".

In Ephesians 2:10, Paul writes, "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." The Greek word for "workmanship" is *poiēma*, from which we get the English word "poem." This verse beautifully illustrates that we are God's masterpiece, His poem, created to perform good works. Our creativity and good deeds are not just random acts; they are a direct result of our creation and a reflection of our creator.

God creates and then makes humanity in His image to be fellow creators. From the initial command to tend the garden (Genesis) to the call to do good works (Ephesians), scripture consistently reinforces the idea that we were "created to create"—to build, innovate, and steward the world in a way that brings glory to our creator. This is a fundamental part of our identity and purpose.

In addition to spotlighting ministry stories from our synod, we will be doing the important and holy work of electing a new synod bishop. Even as we prayerfully discern and elect a new bishop, we will be taking time at this Assembly to come together and honor and give thanks to God for the ministry of Bishop Ginny Aebischer.

Artists from across the synod were invited to showcase their work in a special art exhibit and cocktail reception. As we celebrate gifts of artistic expression, we will recognize the gift of Bishop Ginny's 37 years of artistic ministry!

We are a Synod gifted with so many incredible and creative leaders, faithful congregations and members and artists and it is exciting to be able to bring this celebration to the 2026 Assembly.

The Nominating Committee met in November and have spent hours of faithful work in creating a slate of nominees for elections. We have 21 positions up for election in 2026. This team was careful in their selections, taking time to consider gifts, varied ages, roles within the church, experience, and locations across the state. We thank them for their work. In addition, we have an ecclesiastical ballot as we elect a new Bishop.

It's a joy to be able to plan opportunities to gather once again, not just to conduct the necessary business of the Synod, but to share the incredible stories of ministry happening across our congregations, institutions and partners and learn from one another. Guided by the theme, "Created to Create," I hope this 2026 South Carolina Synod Assembly will inspire us all to utilize our gifts—to build, innovate, and steward the world in a way that brings glory to our Creator. Thank you to everyone who worked to make this Assembly a powerful time of inspiration, sharing, and excitement, leading everyone to proudly proclaim: "THIS is my church!"

The Committee on Agenda and Program Recommends:

1. That nominations from the floor of candidates for any elections held at this 2026 Assembly be accompanied by the requested biographical data on the official form provided for that purpose;
2. That the Committee of Reference and Counsel receive no motions or resolutions after today, June 11, 2026 at 5:30 pm;
3. Other election provisions
 - a. The results of the first ballot for bishop shall be posted in the registration area at Brookland Baptist Banquet and Conference Center, outside the Carolina Ballroom at the Marriott Columbia, and online as soon as they are available on Thursday night, June 11, 2026.
 - b. Persons wishing to withdraw their names after the first ballot for bishop must complete a withdrawal form, which is available at the same place where the results are posted and at the Secretary's desk. Submit the completed withdrawal form to the Secretary's desk by 9:45 am, Friday, June 12, 2026. If a person wishes to remain on the ballot they must complete a biography form, which is available at the same place where the results are posted and at the Secretary's desk. Return the completed biography form to the Secretary's desk by 9:45 am, Friday, June 12, 2026.
 - c. A person, who is not present at Assembly, will be contacted by phone from members of the Conduct of Elections Committee to confirm their wish to remain on the ballot or to withdraw their name for bishop.
 - d. Provided there is no election on the third ballot for bishop, the three persons (plus ties) receiving the greatest number of legal votes on the third ballot will be asked to complete a disclosure form for nominees and submit the form to the Secretary's desk.
 - e. The newly elected bishop is required to provide a written consent to a background check after the election results is announced and prior to installation.
4. That the Bar of the Synod be designated as the registered voting members participating in this assembly who are seated at the tables with the white tablecloths and gold runners;

5. That the Bishop, as Presiding Officer, be given authority to call for items on the agenda in the order deemed appropriate, primarily for the purpose of time management, and specifically with regard to balloting, resolutions and special recognitions during the Assembly;
6. That the proposed agenda be a guide for the 2026 Assembly of the South Carolina Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

Positions open for election with description summaries of responsibilities:

SYNOD COUNCIL

Terms begin after Synod Assembly. Meetings are generally scheduled in June, September, December, February and April. Synod Council members have voice and vote at assemblies and are expected to attend. The Synod Council operates with internal committees. Most committees meet prior to the regular council meetings, but some may also meet at other times.

1. Lay Woman (Eastern Area which includes Amelia, Coastal, and Epiphany Conferences)
2. Lay Woman (At Large)
3. Lay Woman (POC/LOE)
4. Lay Woman Unexpired Term (Northern Area which includes Foothills, Heartland, and Upstate Conferences)
5. Lay Man (At Large)
6. Lay Man (Northern Area which includes Foothills, Heartland, and Upstate Conferences)
7. Lay Man Unexpired Term (At Large)
8. Rostered Minister (At Large)
9. Rostered Minister (Central Area which includes Midlands, Saxe Gotha, and Western Conferences)

COMMITTEE ON DISCIPLINE

The Committee on Discipline of this synod shall consist of 12 persons of whom six shall be rostered ministers and six shall be laypersons, who shall each be elected by the Synod Assembly for a term of six years without consecutive reelection. The functions of the Committee on Discipline of this synod are set forth in Chapter 20 of the Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The Synod Council shall fill vacancies on the Committee of Discipline for any unexpired term.

CONSULTATION COMMITTEE

The Consultation Committee of this synod shall consist of at least six persons and not more than 12 persons, of whom half shall be rostered ministers and half shall be lay persons, who shall each be elected by the Synod Assembly for a term of six years without consecutive reelection. The functions of the Consultation Committee are set forth in Chapter 20 of the Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and in Chapter 17 of this constitution. The size of the Consultation Committee, in accord with this provision, shall be defined in this synod's bylaws. The Consultation Committee of this synod shall consist of 12 persons.

MISSION ENDOWMENT FUND GRANT COMMITTEE

An Endowment Grant Committee for the South Carolina Synod Mission Endowment Fund shall consist of the Bishop of the South Carolina Synod or his/her appointee, the Treasurer of this Synod, and five members elected by the Synod Assembly. Two of the elected members shall be lay women, two shall be lay men, and one shall be an ordained minister on the roster of this Synod. The term of office for the five persons elected by the Synod Assembly to membership on this committee shall be three years; individuals so chosen may not serve more than two consecutive full terms. The members of the Endowment Grant Committee shall not receive compensation for their duties. The Endowment Grant Committee shall be responsible to the South Carolina Synod through the Synod Council and shall provide annually a report of disbursements to the Synod Assembly. The Endowment Grant Committee shall meet at least annually and provide the means, dates, and deadlines for grant requests, review such requests, and make recommendations for disbursements to the Synod Council through the synod's Finance Committee.

SOUTH CAROLINA LUTHERAN RETREAT CENTERS, INC.

Members of the Board of Trustees elected by the Synod Assembly (9) and by the Board (6) may serve two consecutive three-year terms. The Board generally meets four times a year with one meeting being an overnight meeting. Members of the Board benefit the work of the ministry by being active members of committees. The Board promotes and coordinates the ministries at Kinard Conference Center and Coastal Retreat Center. It establishes goals and objectives; oversees policies; is accountable for fiscal affairs; and employs and supervises the Executive Director. Board members are to be active congregational members, skilled in interpersonal relationships, visionary, able to work cooperatively, and advocates for and financial supporters of this ministry.

SC SYNOD NOMINATING PROCESS

The Synod Council recommends and invites people from across the Synod to serve on the Nominating Committee. Representation is gender and clergy/lay person balanced. Committee members serve for two years. Half the committee rotates off each year. The Synod Council names the committee in September. The Nominating Committee meeting is set for mid-October/early November.

The committee members are asked to bring names of potential nominees for the specific open positions. They are encouraged to call the church leaders in their area to solicit names for nominees.

The positions open for nominations are announced in the Synod ENews which allows us to receive nominations from the general population of our Synod.

At the meeting, all names that have been received are listed for the various positions which are up for election. The Constitution is followed on how many nominees are presented for each election.

The committee considers gifts and any potential conflicts which might be present for each potential nominee. Example: Sometimes one person is brought for two different positions and the committee has to decide which position to nominate them for; we check that a person is not nominated for a position that their spouse or immediate relative is already serving in; we make sure we are not putting two people up against each other from the same congregation or nominating someone from a congregation that is already represented on that council, board or committee, etc. This conversation and discernment is surrounded in prayer.

The committee prioritizes the nominees into the order they wish to have them contacted. The committee members divide the list and call persons who have been nominated.

Nominees are sent biographical information forms with a deadline to return the completed form. The synod office tracks and follows up on nominees with the help of the committee and prepares the slate of nominees for publication in our registration materials. Biographical information is published with registration materials for voting members of Assembly.

The Nominating Committee Chair makes the report of the ballots at Assembly and we accept additional nominations from the floor.

I was born, baptized, confirmed, and married in the Lutheran faith in Germany—this is the tradition that has shaped me from the beginning. My deeper spiritual journey began around 2006, during a time of midlife reorientation when I first felt the Spirit gently but persistently calling my soul. By training, I am a chemist and spent many years working in the pharmaceutical industry. However, my permanent move to the United States in 2005 marked a turning point in my life's path. Beginning in 2009, I served in several ministry staff roles at Christ Lutheran Church in Hilton Head Island. What is your most joyous memory from being a part of your faith community?

As parents we have always placed a high value on mission and outreach in our twin sons' lives. In 2011 our son Samuel and I went on a church-sponsored mission trip to Haiti. We had been on mission trips before, but the extreme levels of poverty and need in that country were like none we have ever experienced. As we toured Port-au-Prince homeless encampments, food banks, earthquake victims' graveyards, and an orphan shelter I was overwhelmed with the level of commitment, bravery and grace shown by God's servants in that impoverished place. Samuel was too, and that experience was integral in motivating him toward a lifetime of service. In medical school he worked closely with doctors and fellow students serving Nashville's homeless community, providing field vaccinations and health screenings for that underserved population. Now as an internal medicine doctor at the University of Wisconsin he also serves as medical

At All Saints, the pastors and lay leadership faithfully worked together to develop plans to maintain our community in a time when being "in community" was a danger. Working together, we were able to maintain those connections, to find creative ways to worship together safely, to bring in folks who wanted to hear the gospel in a safe environment, and to expand our outreach. That outreach involved upgrading an outdoor shelter with electricity and plumbing to host multiple AA groups from the area that were no longer allowed to meet in their former spaces. Amazingly, this era allowed us to focus and launch a successful campaign for a building renovation. Though that time was frightening and unprecedented, we leaned on one another (safely and figuratively) to do the work of the gospel in ways that ultimately fostered joy.

One way that the church has been there for me was in the aftermath of my mother's rather sudden death from cancer in 2021. I had never navigated grief like that previously in my life, and it took time for me to navigate that journey. During that journey, there was a tremendous outpouring of support from members of the church; past and present, and from across this great synod (and beyond). With that help and permission to take my time, I was able to accept this new reality, always giving thanks to my mother for leading me to such a community that is filled with God's grace.

Like many pastors, working at camp was where I first felt a sense of calling to be a pastor. It was a place where I could be myself. At camp, I learned I enjoyed leadership, hands-on ministry, and working with others in an intentionally Christian community. I discovered gifts and was able to put them to use. Particularly influential moments at camp include the staff worship services: gathering with close friends around bread and wine, singing praises, and supporting each other. Those worshipful moments had a significant impact on me.

More recently, our congregation has just undergone a nearly year-long renovation of our worship space. In a relatively short time, this congregation has accomplished a lot: a capital campaign, a building renovation, and a new strategic plan to guide our next chapter. These accomplishments aren't just about a few people having good ideas. They happen because God's people chose to move forward together.

The congregation consistently showed up with generosity, patience, and determination. People gave selflessly, yes, but they also prayed, asked thoughtful questions, had tough conversations with kindness, and kept returning to the same deeper "why": so we can worship well, welcome everyone, and serve our neighbors with joy.

During construction and disruption, people adjusted. When decisions needed to be made, people got involved. When it was time to set a direction, people participated and helped shape it. During those times, I felt supported and encouraged, not just as the pastor, but as someone who loves seeing a congregation grow in faith and purpose, mission and ministry.

Through our “wilderness in the Fellowship Hall,” I’ve been reminded that the church is not the building but the people, and I’ve seen that clearly here. St. Philip has risen to the occasion with steady faith and shared ownership of our mission. That is a gift, and it’s a joy to be part of it.
