Equip congregations to engage in their communities


Deepen discipleship

# South Carolina Synod Fact Sheet



The **Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA)** is comprised of 3,600,000 members in 9,252 congregations.

The **South Carolina Synod** is one of 65 synods in the ELCA. The synods are organized into nine regions, and the South Carolina Synod is part of **Region 9**.

Congregations are divided into nine geographic conferences. Each conference has a Dean.

The Office of the Bishop in Columbia, South Carolina

**Governance:** The South Carolina Synod is governed by the annual **Synod Assembly** with the **Synod Council** serving as the synod's board of directors and as the interim legislative authority between meeting of the Synod Assembly. Synod Council members are elected to assure geographical representation.
