Practices Every Ministry Can Implement

- 1. Create a culture of stewardship, not ownership. Whose money is it?
- 2. Integrate gratitude holistically and year-round affirmation
- 3. Connect weekly offerings to mission activities and commitments
- 4. Create a narrative budget and communicate positively
- 5. Free-will offerings rather than event ticket prices
- 6. Separate financial and development/stewardship tasks
- 7. Annually report all assets and bank balances
- 8. Conduct commitment campaign before creating budget
- 9. Enforce separation of duties and requirements of non-profits
- 10. Steward income from donor to bank (counters, deposits, reports)
- 11. Use invoices, budget vs. balance sheet, and create cash reserves
- 12. Create policies that tell future leaders your priorities
- 13. Use understandable and contextual vocabulary
- 14. Talk about legacy gifts
